WHAT IS CDBG?

- The Department of Housing & Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program supports community development activities to build stronger and more resilient communities.
- Activities may address needs such as infrastructure, economic development, housing, and public services.
- Upper Darby Township (UDT) receives an annual entitlement of CDBG funding based on HUD's Community Planning & Development formula in relation to the total CDBG budget allotted by the U.S. Congress. <u>UDT's allocation for Program Year 50 is</u> \$1,699,247.00.
- UDT is required to create an Action Plan each year to address the priority needs identified in UDT's five-year Consolidated Plan. The Action Plan is voted on by Council.
- UDT Community & Economic Development personnel work closely with our technical consultant, Dunleavy & Associates to operate and develop the local CDBG program.

HOW IS THE APPLICATION PROCESS DIFFERENT THIS YEAR?

- UDT has moved to a two-step process. Part One is a Project Approval application for the Action Plan. Part Two is a rigorous and detailed Grant Approval application process. PROJECT APPROVAL DOES NOT GUARANTEE GRANT APPROVAL
- The funding and spending period will run on the calendar year (January -December 2025). Timeliness is a critical component to a successful CDBG program. Therefore, unspent funds may be reallocated to other eligible activities and/or subrecipients at the conclusion of each funding period.
- · Township monitoring will now happen annually, each fall, for all subrecipients.
- The Action Plan process, including Project Approval and Grant Approval, will begin in April 2025 for Program Year 51.

APPLICATION REVIEW

Upper Darby Township PY50 CDBG

Part One: Subrecipient Project Approval Application for the Action Plan

Upper Darby Township (UDT) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Services Project Application Scorecard PY50 (January-December 2025)

This Public Services Project Application Scorecard is based on HUD Subrecipient Guidelines for applicant ranking and analysis.

The Application Rating System guides in selecting projects equitably for CDBG funding, and ranking the degree of the applicant's capacity to be successful in executing the project and meeting all program guidelines in a timely fashion.

The scorecard allows Upper Darby Township to 1) determine whether a prospective subrecipient has the necessary systems in place to comply with the Federal requirements that impact the type of activity being proposed; 2) helps to assess which projects align most closely with Upper Darby Township's community development priorities; and, 3) determine which projects have the greatest potential impact on addressing the needs of the community.

Performance relative to any previous UDT CDBG projects awarded to the applicant, including attainment of objectives in a timely manner, expenditure of funds at a reasonable rate in compliance with the agreement, record of maintenance of funded activities, and adherence to all program requirements may be taken into consideration when scoring.

APPLICATION RATING SYSTEM

1. Eligibility & Benefit: 0-15 Points

Points will be given to proposals that demonstrate the requirement that the activity must be eligible as per HUD guidelines and exclusively benefit low-and-moderate-income persons.

2. Activity Need and Justification: 0-15 Points

The activity will be evaluated in terms of the documentation and justification of community need for the activity. Existing subrecipients requesting increased funding must demonstrate the increased need.

3. Consolidated Plan Priority: 0-10 Points

Activities addressing high priorities as identified in the UDT Consolidated Plan in categories other than Pubic Services, such as First Time Homebuyer Assistance, Fair Housing, and Homeless Assistance.

4. Cost Reasonableness and Effectiveness: 0-10 Points

The activity will be evaluated in terms of: 1) its likelihood of impact on the identified need; and 2) its implementation costs and funding request relative to the operational, financial, and human resources required to implement.

5. Activity Management: 0-10 Points

Points based on thoroughness of documentation and information provided, showing that the resources needed to manage the proposed activity are available and ready.

6. Activity Implementation: <u>0-10 Points</u>

Based on thoroughness of documentation and information provided, showing that resources, such as funding and staffing, needed to implement the proposed activity, are available and ready or are activities that are already in progress or are ready to move forward quickly.

7. Organizational Experience and Capacity: 0-15 Points

Based on the applicant's length of time in operation, history of collaboration with other providers and agencies, and demonstration of success in undertaking projects of similar complexity as the one for which funds are being requested. Is there qualified staff to execute requirements of the UDT CDBG program, including experience managing and reporting out on grant funds and/or prior experience with CDBG or other Federal programs.

8. Activity Sustainability: 0-15 Points

Points will be awarded based on 1) the applicant's demonstrated ability to secure multiple sources of funding for its work generally, and for the proposed activity specifically; and, 2) based on a credibly stated ability to sustain this project after CDBG funds are exhausted, or a demonstrated ability to perform the proposed activity without the use of CDBG funds.
